Rep. Walters Sponsors Bill to Expand Access to Care for Sexual Assault Survivors

Eighty-five percent of hospitals do not provide sexual assault forensic examinations. Rep. Mimi Walters introduced the “Creating Access to Rape kit Exams (CARE) for Survivors Act” to expand care for sexual assault survivors at hospitals that receive federal funding.

“Access to a sexual assault forensic exam is vital for a survivor’s wellbeing and recovery. My bill would significantly expand access to desperately needed care for sexual assault survivors,” said Walters.

Rep. Mimi Walters’ Bill Will Help End Sober Living Home Abuses

Southern California is home to over 1,100 licensed drug treatment facilities, and countless more that are unlicensed – one of the highest concentrations in America.

Sadly, many exploit patients through “patient brokering,” a practice in which patients are “sold” to a rehabilitation or recovery center in exchange for a lucrative fee.

Others do little to treat the underlying causes of addiction, while collecting substantial insurance payments and ignoring neighborhood concerns.

Bad actors are turning sober living facilities into centers for profit not recovery. Their negligence is hurting patients, and our communities.

Reps. Mimi Walters & Judy Chu’s bipartisan “Access to Sober Living Act,” one of the over 50 opioids bills that recently passed the U.S. House of Representatives, would put an end to fraudulent behavior and unethical practices at sober living homes.
